1. Two schools want to use the same big field for a soccer game at the same time. What is the best way for them to solve this problem fairly?

Answer: B) Both schools agree on a schedule to share the field.

Geopolitics is about how people negotiate and create agreements to share resources and space fairly.

2. A king or queen can decide to move a mountain because they don't like where it is sitting.

Answer: B) False

Physical geography, like mountains, cannot be moved; leaders must make rules based on the land as it is.

3. If a town has a river that everyone needs for water, the leaders must create a ___ to make sure no one takes too much.

Answer: C) Rule

Rules or laws are used in geopolitics to manage how resources like water are shared between groups.

4. Countries often become friends because they want to help each other protect their land.

Answer: A) True

Alliances are formed when groups work together for safety and to protect their borders.

Answer: B) Because the steep hill is hard to climb.

Boundaries (or borders) are the lines used to define who controls which piece of land.

Answer: C) Trade apples for water so everyone has both.

8. An island surrounded by water is easier for an army to walk into than a flat field.

Answer: B) False

Water acts as a natural barrier that makes it harder for others to enter a territory.

9. When two leaders shake hands and promise to help each other, they are making a(n) ____.

Answer: C) Agreement

Agreements (or treaties) are the tools used to manage political relationships between places.

10. If you want to build a bridge across a river to visit your friend, why do you need to talk to the friend first?

Answer: A) Because you might need to use their land for the bridge.
