5. A new student joins your class. They are standing alone with their head down. What is the best way to initiate a conversation based on your analysis?

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Answer: B) Smile, say hello, and ask if they want to play a game.

Analyzing a peer's body language (head down) suggests they may be shy; a friendly, low-pressure invitation is the best communicative approach.
