Answer: A) True

'Instantaneous' provides a more precise, scientific connotation than 'snappy' or 'hurried' for a 10th-grade level analysis.

10. True or False: The word 'adversary' is a synonym for 'ally.'

Answer: B) False

'Adversary' means an opponent or enemy, which makes it an antonym, not a synonym, of 'ally' (a partner or supporter).
