Answer Key: Analyze Your Artful Adjectives: 11th Grade Grammar Guide

Imagine dissecting a legal brief or a classic novel to uncover how attributive and predicative adjectives alter the tone of a persuasive argument.

1. In Virginia Woolf's 'Mrs. Dalloway,' the character Clarissa sees the world through a lens of 'leaden' circles of sound. Which type of adjective is 'leaden' in this context of literary tone?

Answer: B) Descriptive Adjective

Descriptive adjectives highlight qualities; here, 'leaden' describes the heavy, oppressive quality of the sound of Big Ben striking.

2. Choose the correct comparative adjective to complete the sentence in a scholarly tone: 'Between the two proposed legislative amendments, the _____ version was deemed less likely to cause social upheaval.'

Answer: A) more conservative

When comparing exactly two items, the comparative form 'more conservative' is grammatically accurate and stylistically appropriate for academic writing.

3. In the phrase 'the aforementioned evidence,' the word 'aforementioned' functions as a demonstrative adjective by identifying specific information mentioned earlier in a text.

Answer: A) True

Demonstrative adjectives point to specific items; 'aforementioned' points back to specific high-level discourse previously stated.

4. Identify the predicative adjective in this sentence: 'After months of grueling negotiations, the diplomat remained steadfast despite the escalating tension.'

Answer: B) steadfast

'Steadfast' follows the linking verb 'remained' and describes the subject 'diplomat,' making it a predicative adjective.

5. Which superlative adjective best emphasizes an extreme within a global context? 'Climate scientists argue that the current decade is the _____ recorded in meteorological history.'

Answer: B) hottest

'Hottest' is the superlative form required to indicate the extreme limit among all recorded decades.

6. Consider the sentence: 'The myriad challenges facing the startup required unorthodox solutions.' What is the function of 'myriad'?

Answer: B) Quantitative adjective indicating an indefinite large number

'Myriad' serves as a quantitative adjective representing a vast, indefinite number of challenges.

7. True or False: In the phrase 'the American Dream,' 'American' is a proper adjective because it is derived from a proper noun.

Answer: A) True

Adjectives derived from proper nouns, like 'American' from 'America,' are classified as proper adjectives and are capitalized.

8. Complete the sentence using an appropriate cumulative adjective order: 'The architect unveiled a _____ model for the new urban center.'

Answer: B) sleek futuristic glass

Standard adjective order typically follows opinion (sleek), age/style (futuristic), then material (glass).

9. In James Baldwin's 'Notes of a Native Son,' the prose is often described as 'incisive.' If you were to change 'incisive' to 'more incisive,' what grammatical shift have you made?

Answer: B) From a positive to a comparative degree

Adding 'more' creates the comparative degree, used to compare the trait between two entities.

10. True or False: The word 'that' in the sentence 'I believe that the argument is flawed' is functioning as a demonstrative adjective.

Answer: B) False

In this sentence, 'that' is a subordinating conjunction introducing a noun clause, not a demonstrative adjective modifying a noun.
