**1. Which group of Native Americans developed an unbreakable secret code based on their native language to assist U.S. Marines in the Pacific theater?**

**Answer:** C) The Navajo Code Talkers

The Navajo language's complex structure and unwritten nature made it an ideal basis for a secure military code that Japanese cryptographers were never able to crack.

**2. The Tuskegee Airmen were the first African American military aviators in the U.S. Army Air Corps.**

**Answer:** A) True

True. The Tuskegee Airmen broke racial barriers and served with distinction, proving that African Americans could master complex aerial combat.

MacArthur led U.S. forces in the Pacific and made this promise when he was forced to evacuate the Philippines in 1942.

**8. To prevent a massive protest march on Washington, President Roosevelt signed \_\_\_\_\_, which prohibited discrimination in defense industries.**

**Answer:** A) Executive Order 8802

Executive Order 8802 was a landmark civil rights victory during the war, banning racial discrimination in the defense industry specifically.
