1. In a play, the words written in italics that tell an actor how to move or speak are called _____.

Answer: B) Stage Directions

Stage directions provide instructions for the actors and crew that are not meant to be spoken aloud during the performance.

2. A monologue is a long speech given by one single character while others are on stage or to the audience.

Answer: A) True

A monologue comes from the Greek words 'monos' (single) and 'logos' (speech), referring to a long speech by one character.

3. The main problem or struggle between characters that drives the story forward is the _____.

Answer: C) Conflict

Conflict is the essential motor of drama; without a struggle or problem to solve, there is no plot development.

4. If a play like 'Peter Pan' focuses on the struggle to stay young and avoid responsibilities, this central idea is known as the _____.

Answer: B) Theme

The theme is the underlying message or big idea that the playwright wants the audience to think about.

5. Which term describes the conversation between two or more characters in a dramatic work?

Answer: D) Dialogue

Dialogue is the verbal exchange between characters and is the primary way the story is told in a play.

Acts are the major divisions of a play, similar to parts or volumes in a book series.

7. Props are the physical objects that actors use on stage during a performance.

Answer: A) True

Props (short for properties) are items like wands, letters, or swords that characters interact with on stage.

8. The part of the plot where the tension reaches its highest point and the outcome is decided is the _____.

Answer: B) Climax

The climax is the turning point of the story where the conflict is confronted directly.

9. A character's _____ refers to the reason why they do or say certain things throughout the play.

Answer: C) Motivation

Motivation is the 'why' behind a character's actions, helping the audience understand their goals.

10. In a script, the list of all characters appearing in the play is usually found at the very end of the document.

Answer: B) False

The 'Cast of Characters' is almost always found at the beginning of a script so the director and actors know who is involved.
