1. In the context of a formal research paper, which adverb best modifies the verb to indicate a high level of certainty? 'The data ____ suggests a correlation between sleep hygiene and cognitive retention.'

Answer: B) Strongly

'Strongly' is an adverb of degree that appropriately conveys a high level of evidentiary support in academic writing.

2. True or False: In the sentence 'The protagonist moved rather cautiously through the abandoned station,' the word 'rather' is an adverb modifying another adverb.
