Young responders identify safe choices and essential first aid steps across 10 scenarios to protect themselves and their friends.

1. You see a small bottle of colorful liquid on the kitchen counter. What is the safest thing to do?

Answer: C) Don't touch it and tell a grown-up

Unknown liquids can be poisonous; children should always ask an adult before touching or tasting things they find.

2. If you are bleeding, you should press a clean cloth firmly against the cut.

Answer: A) True

Applying pressure helps stop the blood so the body can start healing the wound.

3. In an emergency, the special number you should dial on the phone is ____.

Answer: B) 911

911 is the universal emergency number in North America to reach police, fire, or ambulance services.

4. Your friend falls and gets a 'strawberry' scrape on their knee. What is the first step to help?

Answer: B) Wash it with clean water

Washing a scrape with cool, clean water removes dirt and germs to prevent infection.

5. Which item is NOT usually found inside a basic first aid kit?

Answer: C) Ice cream

While ice cream is a treat, first aid kits contain medical supplies like bandages and wipes to treat injuries.

6. When you are riding a scooter or bike, the most important piece of safety gear for your head is a ____.

Answer: C) Helmet

Helmets are designed to protect the brain and skull from injury if you fall.

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7. If your clothes catch fire, you should run as fast as you can to blow the flames out.

Answer: B) False

Running makes fire grow; you should Stop, Drop, and Roll to put out flames on clothing.

8. You see a stranger's dog in the park and want to pet it. What should you do first?

Answer: C) Ask the owner if it is safe to pet

Asking the owner is the safest way to prevent bites, as not all dogs are friendly to strangers.

9. To stay safe near water, even if you are a good swimmer, you should always have a ___ watching you.

Answer: A) Grown-up

Adult supervision is critical for water safety to prevent drowning accidents.

10. Sunscreen helps protect your skin from being burned by the sun.

Answer: A) True

Sunscreen acts as a shield against UV rays that cause painful sunburns.
