**1. In Virginia Woolf's 'Mrs. Dalloway,' the interior monologue often shifts between the 'transitory' nature of thought and the 'enduring' structure of Big Ben. Identify the relationship between 'transitory' and its potential synonym in a high-level academic context.**

**Answer:** A) Ephemeral

Both 'transitory' and 'ephemeral' describe something that lasts for a very short time, a central theme in Woolf's exploration of consciousness.

**2. The diplomat's speech was carefully crafted to be \_\_\_\_; while he appeared to support the treaty, his words actually undermined its foundational principles.**

**Answer:** A) Specious

**Answer:** B) False

These are distinct homophones; a 'compliment' is an expression of praise, whereas a 'complement' refers to something that completes or brings to perfection.

**4. Consider the term 'laconic' used to describe a character's dialogue. Which of the following words serves as the most precise antonym, accounting for both volume and complexity of speech?**

**Answer:** B) Garrulous

'Laconic' means using few words; 'garrulous' means excessively talkative, especially on trivial matters, making them direct opposites.

**Answer:** B) False

'Partisan' refers to strong adherence to a single party, whereas 'bi-partisan' involves the agreement of two opposing parties, making them near-antonyms.

**7. In Milton's 'Paradise Lost,' the architecture of Pandemonium is described as 'stately.' Which synonym would best elevate the description to reflect the 'sublime'—a key 18th-century aesthetic concept?**

**Answer:** A) August

'August' is a high-level synonym for stately or impressive, often used to describe dignity or grandness in classical literature.

**Answer:** B) Lucid / Enigmatic

'Lucid' (clear) and 'Enigmatic' (mysterious) provide the necessary antonymic contrast to fill the 'transparency to opacity' requirement.

**9. Which set of homophones requires the most careful distinction in a thesis paper regarding the 'stationary' nature of social hierarchies versus the 'stationery' used by the bureaucracy that enforces them?**

**Answer:** C) Stationary / Stationery

'Stationary' means not moving (hierarchies), while 'stationery' refers to writing materials (bureaucracy).

**10. True or False: The word 'enervate' is a synonym for 'energize' because the prefix 'e-' indicates an outward flowing of power.**

**Answer:** B) False
