**1. If your teacher says, 'Let's get our ducks in a row,' what are they really asking the class to do?**

**Answer:** C) Get organized and ready to start

This expression means to get everything organized or in the right place before starting something new.

**2. When you are very excited or happy, your teacher might say you are 'tickled \_\_\_\_.'**

**Answer:** B) Pink

To be 'tickled pink' means you are very pleased or amused by something that happened.

**3. True or False: If a friend tells you to 'keep your chin up,' they want you to look at the ceiling.**

**Answer:** B) False

This expression is used to encourage someone to stay happy even when things are going wrong.

**4. Your friend is nervous about a puppet show and you say, 'Break a leg!' Why did you say that?**

**Answer:** A) To wish them good luck

'Break a leg' is a silly way to wish someone good luck before they perform in front of people.

**5. If you are very busy cleaning up the toys, you could say you are a 'busy \_\_\_\_.'**

**Answer:** D) Bee

Bees are known for working hard, so we call hardworking people 'busy bees.'

**6. Grandma says you are 'the apple of her eye.' What does she mean?**

**Answer:** C) She loves you very much

To be the 'apple of someone's eye' means you are their favorite person or they are very proud of you.

**7. True or False: If a teacher says it is 'time to hit the hay,' it is time to take a nap or go to sleep.**

**Answer:** A) True

'Hit the hay' refers to old-fashioned beds made of straw; it means it is time for bed.

**8. When you can't remember a word but you almost know it, you say it is 'on the tip of my \_\_\_\_.'**

**Answer:** C) Tongue

This means you are very close to remembering the word, but it hasn't come out yet.

**9. If you are 'all ears' during story time, what are you doing?**

**Answer:** B) Listening very carefully

Being 'all ears' means you are ready and eager to listen to what is being said.

**10. True or False: If a story is 'a fish out of water,' it means the character feels comfortable and happy.**

**Answer:** B) False

A 'fish out of water' describes someone who feels awkward or out of place in a new situation.
