1. Which of the following is considered a primary source when researching the impacts of the Great Depression?

Answer: C) A diary entry written by a migrant worker in 1934

Primary sources are contemporary accounts or direct evidence from the time period being studied, such as diaries, letters, or original photographs.

2. True or False: In MLA 9th Edition, you must include the full URL (excluding http:// or https://) for most online sources.

Answer: A) True

Current MLA standards require the inclusion of a permalink or URL to help readers locate the exact digital source you used.

Authority examines who the author is, their institutional affiliations, and whether they are qualified to write on the topic.
