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**1. During the revision of a scholarly analysis of Virginia Woolf's 'Mrs. Dalloway,' a writer decides to restructure the essay from a chronological character study to a thematic exploration of 'interiority.' This shift primarily addresses which rhetorical concern?**

**Answer:** B) Structural alignment with the thesis

Substantive revision involves changing the actual content and logic of the argument, whereas editing focuses on surface-level errors like grammar and punctuation.

**Answer:** A) True

Formative assessments occur during the learning/writing process to inform improvements. Peer review helps the writer see where their arguments may be unclear to a target audience.

**Answer:** B) Checking for consistent APA citation formatting and technical jargon accuracy

Editing focuses on the 'mechanics' and 'precision' of the writing, including citation style and technical accuracy, rather than the broad organization or research.

**8. The process of 'Reverse Outlining'—creating an outline based on a finished draft—is a technique primarily used to evaluate \_\_\_\_.**

**Answer:** C) logical flow and organizational coherence

Reverse outlining allows a writer to see the skeleton of their arguments, making it easier to spot sections that are out of order or repetitive during the revision process.
