## Answer Key: Mastering the Tricky Time-Travelers: An Irregular Verb Quest for Pre-K

Little learners identify linguistic patterns and correct 'silly' grammar mistakes to build early confidence in sophisticated speaking habits.

1. Yesterday, the little bird \_\_\_\_ away to the big green tree. (Hint: It is not 'fied'!)

**Answer:** A) flew

In English, we say 'flew' instead of 'fied' because the word changes its middle sound to show it already happened.

2. If you are eating a snack right now, you are eating. But if you finished it last night, you \_\_\_\_ it.

**Answer:** B) ate

The word 'ate' is a special word that doesn't use '-ed' to show we are done with our snack.

3. If I tell you that I 'runned' to the playground yesterday, I am using the right 'grown-up' word.

**Answer:** B) False

False! The word 'run' is a rule-breaker. We say 'ran' when we talk about a race that is over.

4. The bunny hidden in the grass finally came out! He \_\_\_\_ his head up to see.

**Answer:** C) rose

The word 'rose' means to move upward in the past. It sounds like the flower, but it's actually an irregular action word!

5. I \_\_\_\_ my favorite song in the bathtub this morning!

**Answer:** C) sang

When we finish singing, we say we 'sang.' It is a vowel-change verb where the 'i' turns into an 'a'.

6. A magician performed a trick. He \_\_\_\_ a rabbit out of his hat!

**Answer:** B) brought

'Brought' is a very tricky word that changes its spelling almost completely to show the action is finished.

**7. Is it correct to say: 'The caterpillar became a butterfly'?**

**Answer:** A) True

True! 'Become' changes to 'became' to show a change that already happened.

**8. Oh no! Yesterday, I \_\_\_\_\_ my juice on the rug.**

**Answer:** A) spilt

While 'spilled' is sometimes used, 'spilt' is a classic irregular form that experts often use to describe a messy accident!

**9. Which sentence sounds like the most 'correct' story?**

**Answer:** C) The boy slept all night.

We use the word 'slept' because 'sleep' is an irregular verb that ends in a 't' sound for the past tense.

**10. If I 'found' my lost toy, it means I am still looking for it.**

**Answer:** B) False

False! 'Found' is the past version of 'find.' If you found it, the looking is over!
