Hunt for missing words to help the forest animals share their toys while building foundational substitution skills during circle time.

1. The little squirrel found a nut. Which word can we use to talk about the squirrel?

Answer: A) He

We use 'He' or 'She' when talking about one friend or animal instead of saying their name again.

2. The owl is sleeping. ___ is very quiet in the tree.

Answer: B) It

'It' is the right word to use when we are talking about one animal like an owl.

3. If you and a bunny are hopping together, you can say 'We are hopping.'

Answer: A) True

'We' is the word we use when talking about ourselves and someone else together.

4. Look at the busy bees! Which word helps us talk about all of the bees at once?

Answer: C) They

'They' is used when there is more than one bee or friend we are looking at.

5. Teacher says: 'I see a bear!' The bear says: 'The honey is ___!'

Answer: B) Mine

When the bear is talking about something he owns, he calls it 'mine'.

6. When you point to your friend Ben, you should call yourself 'He.'

Answer: B) False

You call yourself 'I' or 'Me.' 'He' is used to talk about your friend Ben.

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7. If the mama bird has a worm, we say the worm belongs to ___.

Answer: C) her

We use 'her' when something belongs to a female animal or person.

8. The fox cleaned ___ tail all by himself.

Answer: B) his

'His' shows that the tail belongs to the boy fox.

9. If a group of turtles is walking, it is okay to say 'She are walking.'

Answer: B) False

'She' is only for one friend. For a group, we should say 'They are walking.'

10. You are talking to a frog. You say, '___ can jump very high!'

Answer: A) You

When we speak directly to a friend or animal, we use the word 'You'.
