1. In the context of a formal academic debate, which word serves as the most appropriate synonym for 'assert'?

Answer: B) Maintain

To 'maintain' an argument is a common academic synonym for asserting or strongly stating a position.

2. The words 'altar' (a ceremonial table) and 'alter' (to change) are examples of homophones.

Answer: A) True

Homophones sound the same but have different spellings and meanings; 'altar' and 'alter' fit this definition perfectly.

3. Select the correct homophone to complete this sentence: The _____ of the flowers in the garden was overwhelming.

7. Which word pair functions as antonyms?

Answer: B) Meager / Plentiful

'Meager' (lacking in quantity) and 'plentiful' (existing in great amounts) are opposites.

8. The ____ of the story left the audience in tears of joy.

Answer: B) Tale

A 'tale' is a narrative or story, while 'tail' refers to the appendage of an animal.

9. In the phrase 'The sun's rays were intense,' the word 'intense' can be replaced by the synonym 'powerful' without changing the meaning.

Answer: A) True

'Powerful' and 'intense' both convey a high degree of strength or force in this context.

10. Which of these is a homophone for 'principal'?

Answer: A) Principle

'Principal' (a school leader or main) and 'principle' (a fundamental truth) sound identical.
