## Answer Key: Shattering Shadows: Sophomore Synthesis of WWII Strategic Shift

Evaluate the geopolitical and industrial complexities of American involvement, moving beyond simple facts to synthesize the global impact of U.S. wartime policy.

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**1. What was the significance of the Bracero Program (1942) in the context of the American home front and wartime labor shortages?**

**Answer:** B) It established a contract labor agreement with Mexico to address agricultural labor voids.

As millions of American men were drafted, the Bracero Program was a diplomatic and economic agreement to bring Mexican laborers to the U.S. to ensure food production stability.

**2. The \_\_\_\_ Executive Order 8802, issued after pressure from A. Philip Randolph, prohibited racial discrimination in the national defense industry.**

**Answer:** A) Roosevelt

President Franklin D. Roosevelt signed this order to prevent a planned march on Washington, marking a significant early federal step toward civil rights in the workplace.

**3. The 'Double V' campaign was a movement by African Americans to achieve victory over fascism abroad and victory over racism at home.**

**Answer:** A) True

The 'Double V' campaign, championed by the Pittsburgh Courier, emphasized that Black Americans were fighting for democratic freedoms they were still denied domestically.

**4. Which strategic innovation was essential to the success of 'Operation Overlord' to ensure the landed troops were supplied without a traditional port?**

**Answer:** B) The implementation of Mulberry Harbors—portable temporary piers

Mulberry Harbors were critical engineering feats that allowed the Allies to offload heavy equipment and supplies directly onto the beaches of Normandy.

**5. The secret project to develop the first atomic weapon, which employed over 130,000 people across the country, was known as the \_\_\_\_ Project.**

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**Answer:** B) Manhattan

The Manhattan Project was the codename for the U.S.-led effort to develop the atomic bomb, culminating in the Trinity test in July 1945.

**6. The Supreme Court case *Korematsu v. United States* (1944) ruled that the internment of Japanese Americans was unconstitutional.**

**Answer:** B) False

In a controversial 6-3 decision, the Court ruled that the need to protect against espionage outweighed Korematsu's individual rights, upholding the internment policy.

**7. What was the primary goal of the United States' 'Island Hopping' strategy in the Pacific Theater?**

**Answer:** C) To capture key islands to use as airbases for bombing mainland Japan

Island hopping allowed U.S. forces to bypass heavily fortified Japanese positions and focus on strategic islands that could support B-29 bomber long-range missions.

**8. General \_\_\_\_\_ oversaw the rebuilding of post-war Japan and the drafting of its new pacifist constitution.**

**Answer:** A) Douglas MacArthur

As Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, MacArthur led the occupation and transformational democratic reforms of Japan from 1945 to 1951.

**9. The Bretton Woods Conference (1944) was established to create a new international financial system and stable exchange rates after the war.**

**Answer:** A) True

The conference led to the creation of the IMF and the World Bank, cementing the U.S. dollar as the world's primary reserve currency.

**10. How did the Servicemen's Readjustment Act of 1944 (G.I. Bill) fundamentally alter the American social landscape after the war?**

**Answer:** C) It fueled the growth of the middle class through education and home loans.

The G.I. Bill democratized higher education and home ownership, leading to the massive suburbanization and economic boom of the 1950s.

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
