1. Which literary technique is used when a narrator deliberately provides inaccurate or biased information, challenging the reader to deduce the truth?

Answer: B) Unreliable narrator

An unreliable narrator, such as in Nabokov's work, forces the reader to analyze the gap between the narrator's account and reality.

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The 'Show, Don't Tell' technique uses sensory imagery to build an immersive world, a core standard for 9th-grade descriptive writing.

Answer: C) Events are disrupted by flashbacks or parallel timelines.

Nonlinear narratives manipulate time to reveal thematic connections rather than just following a chronological sequence.

Answer: A) True

Second-person perspective pulls the reader directly into the action, often used in interactive scripts or avant-garde fiction.

A soliloquy is a specific form of creative expression used in drama to externalize a character's internal state.
