Students identify key domestic shifts and military strategies that defined the United States' transition from neutral observer to global superpower.

1. Which specific strategy did the United States use in the Pacific to bypass heavily fortified Japanese islands and move closer to mainland Japan?

Answer: A) Island Hopping

Island hopping allowed U.S. forces to capture strategic islands for airfields while skipping over others, saving time and resources.

2. To save resources for the military, American citizens used _____ books to buy limited amounts of items like gasoline, coffee, and meat.

Answer: B) Ration

Rationing was a mandatory government program that ensured fair distribution of scarce goods needed for the war effort.

3. The 'Victory Garden' program encouraged Americans to grow their own vegetables to prevent food shortages during the war.

Victory Gardens significantly increased the food supply, allowing more commercially grown produce to be sent to soldiers overseas.

The Battle of Midway severely weakened the Japanese Navy and shifted the momentum of the war to the United States.
