## Answer Key: Think Like a Leader: The Fair Play Challenge for Kindergartners

Students analyze tricky schoolyard scenarios to evaluate fairness and practice the peaceful problem-solving skills used by brave history makers.

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**1. If a new rule said only children with blue shirts could use the swings, would that be fair or unfair?**

**Answer:** B) Unfair, because all children should be allowed to play.

In social studies, we learn that fairness means everyone has the same rights and opportunities, regardless of what they look like or what they wear.

**2. True or False: Using your words and sitting together peacefully is a strong way to change a bad rule.**

**Answer:** A) True

Leaders like those in the Greensboro Sit-ins showed that peaceful actions can be more powerful than fighting.

**3. When a group of people walk together with signs to show they want things to change, it is called a \_\_\_\_.**

**Answer:** C) March

A march is a way for a large group of people to work together so their voices are heard by leaders.

**4. Imagine your friend is not allowed to join a game because of the color of their skin. What is the best way to be a leader?**

**Answer:** B) Tell the group that everyone should be included.

Standing up for others is a key part of the Civil Rights movement and being a good citizen.

**5. True or False: Before the laws changed, some children had to go to different schools just because of how they looked.**

**Answer:** A) True

This was called segregation, and many brave people worked hard to make sure all children could go to school together.

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**6. Which word describes treating everyone the same way, even if they are different from us?**

**Answer:** B) Equality

Equality means that every person has the same value and should be treated with the same kindness and rules.

**7. Ruby Bridges was a very brave girl who went to a new school all by herself to show that \_\_\_ belongs to everyone.**

**Answer:** C) Learning

Ruby Bridges helped integrate schools so that all children could get a good education together.

**8. True or False: You have to be an adult to help make the world a fairer place.**

**Answer:** B) False

Even young children can be leaders by being kind and standing up against unfair rules on the playground.

**9. If you see a sign that says 'No Left-Handed People Allowed,' what should you do to help?**

**Answer:** B) Tell a teacher that the sign is not fair to everyone.

Speaking up when you see something unfair is how people started the movement for better laws.

**10. When people choose to be kind and not fight, even when they are sad or move to change things, they are being \_\_\_.**

**Answer:** B) Nonviolent

Nonviolence was the most important tool used by civil rights leaders to change the country peacefully.
