How does a discordant chord mirror a social revolution? Critique the intersection of avant-garde composition and cultural upheaval.

1. In the context of Arnold Schoenberg's 'Pierrot Lunaire,' how does the use of 'Sprechstimme' function as a departure from traditional vocal performance?

Sprechstimme is a vocal technique where the performer follows the rhythm but only approximates the pitch, creating an eerie, heightened emotional state central to Expressionism.

Musique Concrète utilizes recorded sounds as primary material, moving away from traditional instrumentation and toward the sonic environment as art.
