1. Imagine you are at a playground. If you are a 'Trait Explorer,' and your main trait is 'Bravery,' what are you most likely to do?

Answer: C) Try the big, tall slide for the very first time

Trait theories suggest that our personality is made of consistent habits; a brave person's 'pattern' is to try new, exciting things.

2. True or False: A scientist who studies personality believes that every single person in your class has the exact same thoughts and feelings.

Answer: B) False

Personality is what makes us unique; theories help explain why everyone reacts differently to the same situation.

3. When you learn to tie your shoes because you watched your older brother do it, you are using _____ learning.

Answer: B) Observational

Social-cognitive theory says we develop part of our personality and skills by observing (watching) the people around us.

4. Leo wants to be the best soccer player. Even though he misses a goal, he tells himself, 'I can get better if I keep practicing!' This belief in himself is called:

Answer: A) Self-efficacy

Self-efficacy is the specific belief that you have the ability to succeed at a task if you work at it.

5. True or False: Humanistic theories suggest that all kids have a 'seed' inside them that wants to grow into the best version of themselves.

Answer: A) True

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Humanistic theory focuses on personal growth and the idea that people naturally want to reach their full potential.

6. Maya is very organized. Her desk is neat, and her homework is always on time. Which trait best describes Maya's personality pattern?

Answer: C) Conscientiousness

Conscientiousness is a trait that describes people who are organized, dependable, and careful with their work.

7. Some theories say our 'Unconscious' mind is like an _____ because most of it is hidden under the water where we can't see it.

Answer: B) Iceberg

Psychodynamic theories often use the iceberg metaphor to show that many of our feelings are hidden deep 'below the surface' of our minds.

8. If a person is 'Introverted,' how might they choose to spend their Saturday afternoon?

Answer: B) Drawing a picture alone in their room

Introversion is a trait where a person feels more comfortable and energized by quiet, solo activities.

9. True or False: Your environment (the places you go and people you are with) can actually help change your behavior.

Answer: A) True

Social-cognitive theories explain that our personality is shaped by the interaction between our traits and our environment.

10. A student who shares their lunch because they want to be a 'kind person' is following their _____ self.

Answer: B) Ideal

Humanistic theorists believe we have an 'ideal self'—the person we would like to be—which guides how we act.
