Answer Key: Nail First Aid Safety Essentials for 1st Grade

Young learners design safety plans and organize survival steps for scenarios like nosebleeds, bee stings, and playground scrapes.

1. You are playing and your friend gets a nosebleed. What is the very first thing you should do to help them?

Answer: B) Tell an adult right away

In an emergency, the most important step for a child is to find a trusted adult who knows how to provide medical care.

2. If you see a _____ on the ground, you should never pick it up because it could be sharp and carry germs.

Answer: B) Used needle or syringe

Found medical waste like needles is very dangerous; students must synthesize the danger of germs and sharp objects by choosing to avoid them.

3. True or False: If you get a bee sting, it is a good idea to tell an adult immediately in case you have an allergy.

Answer: A) True

Bee stings can cause allergic reactions in some people, so notifying an adult is a critical safety step for monitoring health.

4. Imagine you see a bottle of colorful liquid under the sink that looks like juice. What is the safest choice?

Answer: C) Don't touch it and stay away

Hazardous chemicals often look like drinks; identifying a potential poison risk and choosing 'don't touch' shows advanced safety reasoning.

5. When you are building a first aid kit for a hiking trip, you should definitely include _____ to clean a dirty scrape.

Answer: B) Antiseptic wipes

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Cleaning a wound is the first step in skin first aid; students must determine which tool is functional for preventing infection.

6. True or False: If a stranger asks you for help finding a lost puppy, you should go with them alone to be helpful.

Answer: B) False

Personal safety rules teach that children should never go anywhere with a stranger without their parent's permission, even to help.

7. You see a classmate fall on the playground and they cannot get up. What is the smartest way to show leadership in this emergency?

Answer: B) Ask one friend to stay with them while you run for a teacher

Answer: A) Trusted Adult

The term 'Trusted Adult' is a foundational concept in safety education, referring to teachers, nurses, or parents.

Answer: A) True

The buddy system is a proactive safety strategy that uses peer support to minimize risks during activities.
