Assess recall of foundational musical components through stylistic analysis of jazz, choral, and cinematic arrangements.

**1. Which term describes the unique 'color' of a Note, such as the difference between a distorted electric guitar and a clean acoustic guitar?**

**Answer:** B) Timbre

Timbre refers to the specific sound quality or 'tone color' that allows us to distinguish between different instruments even if they play the same note.

**2. A piece of music described as 'Andante' is being played at a very fast, energetic tempo.**

**Answer:** B) False

Andante is a musical term for a 'walking pace' or moderate tempo, whereas terms like Presto or Allegro indicate fast speeds.

**3. In a standard jazz arrangement, when three horns play different notes simultaneously to support the lead singer, which element are they creating?**

**Answer:** C) Harmony

Harmony is the result of multiple pitches being sounded at the same time to create chords and provide vertical depth to the music.

**4. A sudden change in volume from very soft to very loud involves the manipulation of \_\_\_\_\_.**

**Answer:** C) Dynamics

Dynamics refer to the volume of the sound, including gradual changes like crescendos or sudden shifts in loudness.

**8. Which of these would most likely affect the 'Tempo' of a musical performance?**

**Answer:** B) Adjusting a metronome to a higher BPM

Tempo refers to the speed of the beat, measured in Beats Per Minute (BPM).

**9. When an R&B singer performs an unaccompanied vocal line without any instruments, the musical texture lacks \_\_\_\_\_.**

Harmony requires multiple different pitches sounded together; a single unaccompanied vocal line is monophonic and lacks harmonic support.

**10. Pitch refers to the duration of a note, indicating how long it should be held.**
