1. Which interval is created by the first two notes of the 'Star Wars' Main Theme (the jump from the first note to the second)?

Answer: B) Perfect Fifth

The leap from the tonic to the dominant in the Star Wars theme is a Perfect Fifth (7 semitones), known for its powerful and open sound.

2. A 'key signature' is placed at the beginning of a piece to indicate which notes will be consistently raised (sharps) or lowered (flats).

Answer: A) True

Key signatures provide a shorthand for the performer, establishing the tonal center and the grouping of sharps or flats used throughout the work.

3. The _____ scale is a seven-note scale characterized by its 'darker' or 'sadder' sound, often featuring a lowered third degree.

Answer: C) Minor

Minor scales are defined by their specific intervals (like the minor third), which listeners typically associate with complex or somber emotions.

4. If a composer wants to create a feeling of stability and rest at the end of a phrase, which chord are they most likely to use?

The Tonic (I) chord acts as 'home base' in a key, providing resolution and a sense of finality to a musical idea.

5. How many sharps are found in the key signature of E Major?

Answer: C) Four (F#, C#, G#, D#)

Based on the Circle of Fifths, E Major contains four sharps: F#, C#, G#, and D#.

6. In basic music composition, repeating a short melodic or rhythmic idea throughout a piece is called a ____.

A motif is a short musical fragment or recurring figure that helps unify a composition through repetition.

7. A 'Major Triad' is composed of a Root, a Major Third, and a Perfect Fifth.

8. Which of these scales uses only five notes per octave and is common in various global folk traditions?

10. A 'sharp' (#) symbol tells the performer to lower the pitch by one half-step.

A sharp raises a pitch by a half-step; a flat (b) is the symbol used to lower a pitch.
