Answer: B) Expository

Expository writing focuses on clarifying complex processes and informing the reader through factual breakdown rather than debate.

7. In an advanced essay, the section where a writer anticipates and refutes an opposing viewpoint is known as the _____.

Answer: C) Counterargument

A counterargument is essential in high-school level argumentative writing to demonstrate a comprehensive understanding of the topic's complexity.
