1. Imagine your class is creating a 'Class Constitution.' If the class decides that everyone must follow the rules they all agreed on, what are they practicing?

Answer: A) The Rule of Law

The Rule of Law means that laws apply to everyone equally, even the people who lead the group.

Answer: A) Monarchy

A monarchy is a form of government where power is passed down through a specific family, often for life.

8. Which of these is a 'Natural Right' that many philosophers believe every human is born with?

Answer: C) The right to liberty (freedom)

Natural rights are basic freedoms that philosophers believe people have just because they are human.

9. Justice always means giving every single person the exact same thing, even if they have different needs.

Answer: B) False

Many philosophers argue that justice (equity) means giving people what they need to be successful, which isn't always the exact same thing.

10. If a community believes and acts as if the 'Common Good' is most important, they are focusing on ____.

Answer: A) What is best for the group

The 'Common Good' refers to actions or policies that benefit the whole community rather than just a few individuals.
