Answer Key: Will You Ace This Pre-K Time Traveler's Irregular Verb Quiz?

Young storytellers transform their weekend tales by choosing the right words for things that already happened in our classroom adventures.

1. Yesterday, we to the playground for a picnic. Help me finish my story!

Answer: B) went

Even though many words use -ed for the past, the word 'go' changes completely to 'went' when the trip is finished.

2. The little bird ___ away after it ate the crumbs. Which word sounds right?

Answer: C) flew

When we talk about a bird that already left, we use the special word 'flew' instead of adding an -ed sound.

3. If you are telling a story about a snack you finished, is it correct to say 'I ate the apple'?

Answer: A) True

'Ate' is the special past version of 'eat.' We don't say 'eated' because it is an irregular verb.

4. Imagine you dropped your toy. How do you tell your teacher? 'I ___ my toy.'

Answer: D) broke

To show something is already in pieces, 'break' turns into 'broke.' This is a synthesis of identifying the action and its past form.

5. Last night, the moon ___ very bright in the sky. Which word fits?

Answer: A) shone

While 'shined' is sometimes used, 'shone' is a classic irregular form often used to describe how things looked in the past.

6. If you finished your juice, should you say 'I drunk it all'?

Answer: B) False

To say you finished it, you would usually say 'I drank it.' 'Drunk' is a different form used with words like 'have.'

7. Your friend hid the ball! You look and look, then you shout: 'I ___ it!'

Answer: B) found

When the search is over, we say 'found.' This requires choosing the irregular form over the logical but incorrect 'finded.'

8. We were very quiet, but then the bell ___. What did the bell do?

Answer: C) rang

The word 'ring' changes its vowel from 'i' to 'a' to become 'rang' when we talk about the past.

9. Is it right to say 'I seed a giant dinosaur at the park yesterday'?

Answer: B) False

The past tense of 'see' is 'saw.' Even though it happened in the past, we don't add -ed to see.

10. Choose the best sentence to describe a song you finished in music class:

Answer: C) We sang a loud song.

For most simple stories about the past, 'sang' is the correct irregular form to use for the action of singing.
