**Answer:** B) Magical Realism

Magical realism treats supernatural elements as a normal, integrated part of an otherwise realistic setting.

**7. True or False: Using 'minimalist' prose involves stripping away excessive adjectives and adverbs to allow the reader to infer meaning from simple, direct actions.**

**Answer:** A) True

Minimalism focuses on surface description and economy of words, popularized by writers like Ernest Hemingway or Raymond Carver.
