Answer: D) Making eye contact and nodding to show you understand.

Active listening involves non-verbal cues like eye contact and nodding to prove you are focused on the speaker's message.

4. You receive a gift that you already have at home. What is the best way to respond to the person who gave it to you?

Answer: A) Say, 'Thank you so much! It was very kind of you to think of me.'

The purpose of communication in gift-giving is to acknowledge the giver's kindness rather than the item itself.

5. If you accidentally bump into someone in the hallway, what is the most appropriate phrase to use?

Answer: B) 'Excuse me, I'm sorry.'
