Answer: B) Wave your hands and call out to show you are 'open'

Effective communication and finding 'open space' are advanced strategies that allow a teammate to pass the ball away from defenders.

2. In a team game, a 'strategy' is a secret plan that teammates make together to help them reach a goal.

Answer: A) True

Strategies are collaborative plans used to coordinate movements and outsmart the opposing team's defense.

3. When you and a friend are playing a game like relay-racing and you cheer 'Go, go, go!', you are using the skill of _____.

Answer: C) Encouragement

Encouragement is a social-emotional teamwork skill that boosts morale and helps a team perform better under pressure.

4. Imagine you are the 'Captain' of a tag team. If your team is losing energy, which new rule could you create to help everyone work together better?

Answer: C) Players must hold hands in pairs to support each other

Creating rules that foster physical or tactical support requires synthesis of teamwork concepts to improve group performance.

5. If a teammate makes a mistake, an advanced team player should get angry so the teammate learns faster.

Answer: B) False

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Advanced teamwork requires empathy and constructive support, as negative reactions usually hurt the team's ability to coordinate.

6. In a game of 'Keep Away,' if three players stand in a triangle shape around one defender, they are using _____ awareness.

Answer: A) Spatial

Spatial awareness involves understanding where your body and your teammates are located in relation to the goal and the opponents.

7. You are playing a game with a ball and a net. Your team decides to 'Rotate' (move to new spots). Why would you synthesize this plan?

Answer: B) To give everyone a chance to try different roles

Rotating roles is a high-level strategy that builds a more versatile team where every player understands different responsibilities.

8. A player who watches the whole field and tells their friends where the ball is going is acting like a _____.

Answer: B) Leader

Leadership in team sports involves processing information quickly and communicating it to help the group succeed.

9. Passing the ball is often faster than running with the ball yourself.

Answer: A) True

This is a fundamental tactical concept; the ball moves faster through the air or across the ground than a player can run.

10. Two teams are playing a game of 'Scooter Hockey.' Team A is all grouped together in one corner. Team B is spread out across the whole floor. Who has the better strategy?

Answer: B) Team B, because they can cover more space and pass easier
