1. If a new student joins our class, what is the fairest way to make them feel welcome?

Answer: B) Invite them to join the game and share the rules

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7. Who is usually the 'authority' figure responsible for safety in a swimming pool?

Answer: B) The lifeguard

An authority is someone we give power to because they help keep order and keep us safe.
