## Answer Key: Stay Calm and Save Lives: A 9th Grade Safety Challenge

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**1. When encountering an unconscious individual, what is the very first step a responder should take according to standard emergency protocols?**

**Answer:** B) Assess the scene for safety

Scene safety is the priority to ensure the responder does not also become a victim of hazards like traffic, fire, or electricity.
