Character development describes the way a person in a story or play changes, learns, or grows from the beginning to the end.

Answer: C) Stage directions

Stage directions provide essential instructions to the cast and crew about movement and the physical environment of the scene.

A monologue is a long speech by one actor, often used to reveal feelings that other characters in the play don't know about yet.

10. Why might a playwright include a 'subplot' in a play about a king losing his crown?
